S6 Pupils: Police Scotland in Elgin have been in touch to let you all know that they are hosting a **Special Constable Open Evening** at the Elgin Police Station on **24 April 2018 from 6.30 pm-8.30 pm**. You do have to be 18 years of age to become a Special Constable but they have said they would like school/college pupils who may not be of age yet to still attend if they may want to join in the future. "The Special Constabulary is a part-time, volunteer body consisting of officers with similar powers to that of police officers. As a special constable, you'll work alongside our police officers – forging strong partnerships in the community, patrolling our streets, preventing crime and interacting with all kinds of people to help keep your local community safe."
